

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

National seminar exercise 2024

The National seminar exercise 2024 (NSÖ 24) was planned and executed in a cross-agency exercise planning group consisting of the Swedish Civil Conlingencies Agency (MSB), the Swedish National Board of Health and Welfare, and the Swedish Armed Forces. The aim of the exercise was to explore Sweden's total defense capability relating to patient flow management in accordance to NATO's expectations on Sweden so a member state.

The target group was organizations with a particular responsibility for patient flow management in the Swedish total defense, such as transport, logistics, healthcare, border control, etc. The format was characterized by a climate of learning and lack of prestige, where participants developed their knowledge and understanding through discussions based on the exercise objectives, questions and the scenario.

Exercise objectives

Three exercise objectives were formulated from the objectives of CAMO 24 and also adapted to the national conditions in the National exercise directions and the organizations' levels of knowledge in the subject area.

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CAMO 24

Casualty Move 2024 (CAMO 24) was a NATOled exercise with the aim to practise civil-military cooperation and coordination between the EU, NATO and member states regarding patient flow management during war. It was the fourth exercise in an annual exercise series. Concurrently to CAMO 24, the plug-in exercise NSÖ 24 took place with the purpose to utilize the NATO-exerise, and thus strengthening the swedish national total defence capability. A total of 16 nations participated in CAMO 24,
